**Send Official College Transcript** (transfer students only): Required from ALL previous colleges or universities. Non-English transcripts require a certified English translation accompanied by original transcript.

**Request Test Scores:** Have scores from **one** of the following sent directly from the testing agency. Transfer applicants who have earned 24 or more credits from a U.S.-based college (a college English class must be one of the classes) are not required to submit a score.
