

# APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS AND TIMELINE



- 1** Meet with the 2+2 coordinator at your university to make sure you are on track and have successfully completed the appropriate courses to transfer to Binghamton University.
- 2** Complete Binghamton University's Watson School 2+2 International Student Transfer Program Application and International Student Financial Statement available at <http://www.admissions.binghamton.edu>.
  - Attach an official bank statement (required)
- 3** Complete the online foreign academic credit evaluation via World Education Services (WES) at <http://www.wes.org>. You must have your academic courses evaluated in order to have them understood and recognized by Binghamton University. The WES evaluation will provide you with the USA academic equivalents for your courses. Cost and process information is available on the WES website.
- 4** Request the following official documentation to be submitted with your application:
  - Official university transcripts from any and all universities attended
  - Official secondary school transcript
  - Official TOEFL score results (TOEFL code 2535). Scores may be sent directly from the processor.
- 5** **By March 1:** Complete ALL applications and submit all required materials. Be sure all materials contain complete contact information, including full name, date of birth, address, etc.

- 6** **April:** Receive official notification of admission or denial to the program.
- 7** **By May 1:** Respond to e-mail message from [iss@binghamton.edu](mailto:iss@binghamton.edu) titled "Your Admission to Binghamton University."
  - Complete online response sheet to confirm that you will attend Binghamton University
  - You may request express mail service for the I-20 if you have a MasterCard, Visa or American Express card, or access to one.
  - Indicate campus housing need: Housing on the Binghamton University campus offers the advantages of its proximity and convenience to classrooms, dining services, the library and other campus facilities and services. In addition, staff members are available in each residential complex to assist students with any needs, questions or concerns. A number of the residence halls are open during holiday and vacation breaks.
- 8** **By June 1:** Receive I-20 and letter to present at visa interview at US embassy or consulate nearest your home.
  - Pay required \$200 SEVIS fee and schedule your visa interview appointment
  - Schedule your visa interview appointment at <https://www.vfs-usa.co.in/home.aspx>
- 9** **In June, July, August:** Go to your US visa interview appointment with required documents, including passport, as described at <http://iss.binghamton.edu/pubs/preinfo.html>.
  - If your visa interview is successful, the visa stamp will be placed in the passport
  - Make travel arrangements to Binghamton University after your visa is approved. Visit <http://iss.binghamton.edu/admission/butavel.htm> for information about nearby airports, transportation options, etc.
- 10** **August 24:** Deadline for arrival in Binghamton
  - Attend mandatory International Student Orientation Program
