### **REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BA:**

9 Art Courses

1 Art History Course

Most community colleges offer Art courses that fulfill major requirements and electives.

**Please note that a maximum of 4 transferred courses may count toward the major.**

Additional courses may transfer and count as part of the 126 credits needed for graduation and completion of an Art courses will automatically fulfill the Aesthetics and Humanities General Education Requirement.

### **Core requirements**

Three level-one courses (12 credits) from the following: ARTS 171 Drawing I, ARTS 210 Graphic Design I, ARTS 230 Sculpture I, ARTS 240 Painting I. For the Graphic Design Major, ARTS 161 Beginning Photography will count for one of these three.

#### **BCC transfer equivalencies for core courses:**

**Art History:** One Art History Course (4 credits)

The following BCC courses can satisfy the art history requirement. (Note that there is a maximum of four transferred courses that can count toward the major.)

- ART 102 History of Western Art I
- ART 103 History of Western Art II
- ART 104 History of Asian Art
- ART 108 History of Architecture I
- ART 109 History of Architecture II
- ART 114 The History of Art and the Human Figure

**Electives:** Three studio art electives (12 credits)

**Total:** 40 Credits
