REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BA:

9 Art Courses

1 Art History Course

Most community colleges offer Art courses that fulfill major requirements and electives.

Please note that a maximum of 4 transferred courses may count toward the major.

Additional courses may transfer and count as part of the 126 credits needed for graduation and completion of an Art courses will automatically fulfill the Aesthetics and Humanities General Education Requirement.

Core requirements

Three level-one courses (12 credits) from the following: ARTS 171 Drawing I, ARTS 210 Graphic Design I, ARTS 230 Sculpture I, ARTS 240 Painting I. For the Graphic Design Major, ARTS 161 Beginning Photography will count for one of these three.
