academic opportunities such as combined degrees, foreign-language study groups and an unparalleled international education program.

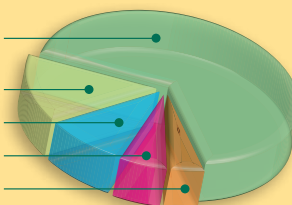
- The campus population consists of 11,706 undergraduates and 3,007 graduate students.

Enrollment is as follows:

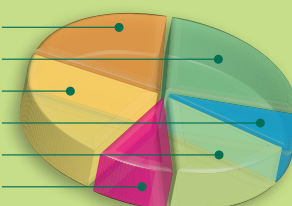

Employers large and small — from across New York state and beyond — recruit Binghamton students. Our graduates pursue rewarding careers with a wide range of organizations and companies. Many employers recruit “any major” while others target students from specific disciplines.

EMPLOYER SERVICES AND RELATIONS

Binghamton University’s Career Development Center provides services to meet your organization’s professional full-time and internship staffing needs. Our outstanding students may be recruited through a variety of means, and our dedicated staff will work with you to determine the best recruiting methods for your organization. Our services and programs include:

■ **eRecruiting** — The CDC uses this online system to manage on-campus recruiting, job and internship postings, and Resume Books; eRecruiting

enables students to access employer information and job postings 24/7. **Employers** can contact us directly at 607-777-2553.

■ **Job and Internship Postings** — Binghamton University students and alumni can view employers’ current professional full-time job vacancies (requiring a minimum of a bachelor’s degree) and internship opportunities posted on eRecruiting. **Employers:** To get started, e-mail your posting to: cdcjobs@binghamton.edu.

■ **The Career Development Center Internship Program** — Join our *credit-bearing program*, where students do internships and take an academic course. **Employers:** If you are interested in supervising an intern through the CDCI program, please call the academic internship program coordinator at 607-777-2545.

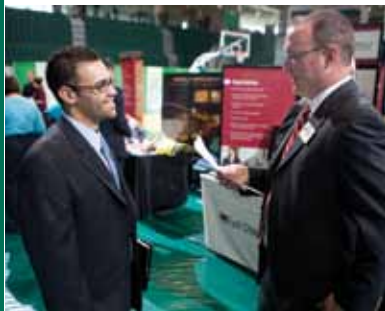
■ **On-Campus Recruiting Program** — Employers are invited to review resumes submitted by students specifically interested in their particular organization and vacancy, whether it’s a full-time position or an internship opportunity. Students submit their resumes online using eRecruiting. From the resumes posted, the employers identify those candidates with whom they wish to speak (in private interview rooms at our facility).

■ **The Job and Internship Fairs and Nursing Forums** — Held each year, these events provide great opportunities for students to have face-to-face contact with prospective employees. Employers: Once you’re registered on eRecruiting, you will receive an invitation to these events.

■ **Presentation/Information Sessions or Table in the University Union** — These enable employers to meet with the general student population and provide information about their organization or program.

■ **Resume Books** — Employers use Resume Books to perform keyword searches in order to target Binghamton candidates; this service is accessible through eRecruiting.
