THINGS YOU NEED TO DO

Before You Can Register

1

Fill out the green Medical History Report and send it back to us. The front of the form and Parts A and B must be filled out (information about these sections is provided later in this brochure). While we strongly recommend you complete Part D, it isn't required.

2

If you're not 18 years old yet, then you must also have your parent or guardian fill out the pink Consent for Medical/Emergency Treatment and send that back to us.

3

Fill out the blue Tuberculosis Screening form and return it to us.

4

By the Sixth Week of Classes

Undergraduate students only: Complete the orange Student Health Insurance Waiver form and send it to the Student Accounts Office if you don't need the Student Accident and Sickness Plan because you have alternative insurance coverage.



THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

1 Eligibility to Register for Classes Rests with YOU

You MUST fill out the front of Form 1 along with Parts A and B. We need this form returned to us before you arrive for Orientation. Students won't be allowed to register for classes until this documentation is complete.

IF YOU DON'T DO THIS YOU WON'T BE OFFICIALLY REGISTERED FOR COURSES AND YOUR CAMPUS HOUSING AND ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL AID WILL BE AFFECTED. YOU WON'T BE ABLE TO REMAIN IN CAMPUS HOUSING AND WE WON'T BE ABLE TO PROCESS YOUR FINANCIAL AID OR GENERATE ANY APPLICABLE REFUNDS.

ABOUT PART A

The meningitis acknowledgement section of Form 1 is mandated by New York state and required from all students. The vaccine itself isn't required, but acknowledging a decision to receive it or not is. If you wish to receive this vaccination, it's available at the University Health Service for a fee. ABOUT PART B

New York State Public Health Law requires you to provide proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella*, and Part B of Form 1 is where you do this. This section must be signed by a health care provider to be considered acceptable. More information about proof of immunity is available at www2.binghamton.edu/health/new-students/health-form.html. The measles, mumps and rubella vaccine is available at the University Health Service for free.

3 Tuberculosis Screening Form

Undergraduate students taking 12 or more credits and graduate students taking 9 or more credits must complete Form 3 and return it to the University Health Service. For more information, go to www2.binghamton.edu/health/new-students/health-form.html.

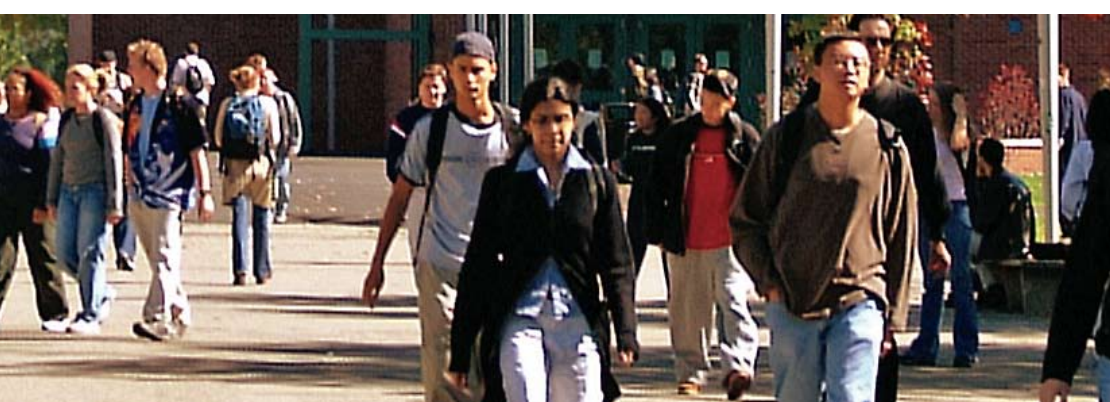

Before You Arrive

- Make sure you know about your health history.
- Carry a list of any medication allergies you have.
- Bring your health insurance card or a copy of it.
- If you take medications on an ongoing basis, be sure to bring enough with you or ask your doctor to send a summary of your needs to the University Health Service's medical director. This will allow our medical director to write a prescription for you if you need one.

ORY THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

University Health Fee

Each semester you pay a Student Health Fee that supports University Health Service programs and services. Since the fee is pre-paid, you won't be charged for any University Health Service visits, health education materials or programs. Your health fee also covers the cost of many medications and common medical supplies as long as University Health Service medical staff provide them to/order them for you.

4 University Health Insurance

Undergraduate students will automatically be enrolled in the Student Accident and Sickness Plan (University health insurance) unless you waive this plan by returning a signed waiver form that states you have alternate coverage (the orange waiver form). Before waiving the University plan, be sure your current coverage can be used for outpatient (laboratory and X-ray) services and specialist referrals in the Binghamton area. Local systems include United Health Services (www.uhs.net) and Lourdes Hospital (www.lourdes.com). And if you're waiving the student plan, make sure you understand about your insurance coverage and have important insurance information (contact information, plan and group numbers, etc.) on hand.

Health insurance helps with expenses incurred by receiving medical care off campus. This could happen if:

- you visit an emergency room when the Health Service is closed
- you go to a walk-in clinic when the Health Service is closed
- the Health Service sends you off campus for urgent care, stitches, X-rays, etc.
- you need to be hospitalized
- you need specialist care
- you need surgery

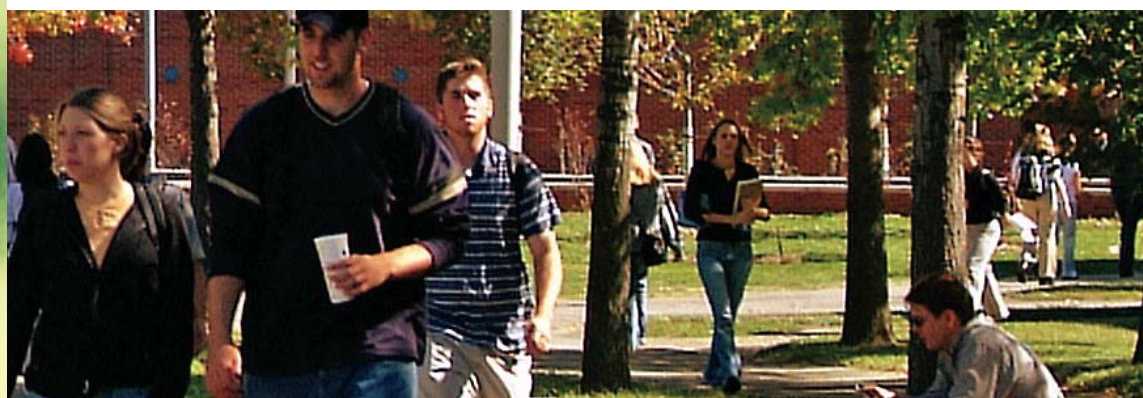
Graduate students have the option of enrolling in the Student Accident and Sickness Plan. International students (undergraduate and graduate) are covered under a special insurance policy.
