Transfer Planning Guide

The Political Science department offers the BA degree. Because the Political Science major consists mostly of upper-level coursework, it is generally recommended that transfer students from two year colleges concentrate on fulfilling the SUNY General Education requirements prior to enrolling at Binghamton (see below).

Course Requirements and Broome Community College Course Equivalencies

Part I. Political Science 10 Course Requirement
Not more than three 100-level courses can be taken

Three courses - one in 3 of the following 4 subfields:

American Politics (AP scores of 3, 4, 5 received for Amer Govt & Politics will count) ***POS 201 at Broome Community College will count toward American Politics***

Comparative Politics (AP scores of 3, 4, 5 received for Comparative Government will count) ***No courses at BCC will count toward this***

International Relations ***No courses at BCC will count toward this***

Political Theory ***No courses at BCC will count toward this***

Five other Political Science courses

Two 400-level Political Science courses (must be taken in residence at Binghamton University)

Part II: Four course requirement in at least 3 different allied Social Science disciplines. (Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, and Sociology)

BCC courses with the prefixes ANT, ECO, GEO, HIS, and SOC will fulfill this.

Other pertinent information:

- Courses passed with a D do not fulfill requirements for the major
- Courses taken P/F do not count toward the major
- A transfer student must take at least 4 political science courses in residence at Binghamton University.
- Only two independent study courses may count toward the major for a total of 8 credit hrs. (Collaborative research is considered an independent study.)
- Honors at the 400-level does not fulfill the 400-level seminar requirement
- At least 24 upper level credits are required (300 or 400 levels).
