

The Department of Psychology at **Binghamton University (SUNY)** invites applications for a position at the Associate or Full Professor level to join our faculty.

Due to the University's commitment to expand alcohol research within a broader healthcare initiative, we seek an established **alcohol researcher** with developmental interests and a strong record of research productivity and funding. We are seeking an individual whose research would complement and extend ongoing research of the Developmental Exposure Alcohol Research Center (DEARC), a NIAAA-funded alcohol research center uniting alcohol researchers at Binghamton, Upstate Medical University in Syracuse, and other institutions in upstate New York (see website at [sunydearc.org](http://sunydearc.org)). The area of specialization within the alcohol field is open, although alcohol researchers with experience in developmental and adolescent neuroscience are particularly encouraged to apply. In addition to a strong interest in joining our diverse group of alcohol researchers, the successful candidate will be expected to contribute to undergraduate and graduate teaching in our department. The Psychology Department comprises 30 tenured or tenure-track faculty, as well as numerous research faculty, in three graduate programs of Cognitive and Behavioral Sciences, Behavioral Neuroscience, and Clinical Science. Research programs of faculty in the Behavioral Neuroscience program are housed in a new, state-of-the-art animal facility and include, in addition to emphases in alcohol/drug abuse, research investigating neural development, plasticity, stress, neuroimmunology, memory, sensory coding, and animal models of Parkinson's disease and Korsakoff's syndrome. Research foci in the Clinical Science program include research on alcohol abuse, marital dysfunction and dissociation, as well as the psychopathology of anxiety disorders, autism, depression, and schizophrenia. The Cognitive and Behavioral Sciences area has current strengths in visual and auditory perception, learning and memory, language processing, categorization and executive function.
