- **Transfer credit will not be accepted for 400 level courses & independent study**

- Mathematics:** MATH 130, 220, 221 and 222 (*only these 4 courses*)
- Philosophy:** PHIL 121, 122, 200 (*only these 3 courses*)
- Physics:** PHYS (all)
- Math/Science transfer equivalents:** MSCI (all)
