

**Rule #1**

**Consumption, possession or purchase of alcoholic beverages by any person less than twenty-one (21) years of age. Distribution of alcoholic beverages to anyone less than twenty-one (21) years of age.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<p><b>Rule #1: Underage drinking</b></p> <p>Underage individual with <b>small</b> amount of alcohol (6 pack of cans/bottles or 1 bottle of wine/liquor).</p> <p>Note: Including alcohol found during room inspection.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year disciplinary warning.</li><li>▪ Under the Influence.</li></ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li></ul> <p><u>Third offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li><li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li><li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li></ul>
<p><b>Rule #1: Underage drinking</b></p> <p>Underage individual with <b>large</b> amount of alcohol.</p> <p>Note: Including alcohol found during room inspection.</p> <p>Note: In party situations, the host(s) should be sanctioned for either small or large amount of alcohol based on the total amount present at the party. Others in attendance should be sanctioned for either small or large amount of alcohol based on the amount you determined they possessed and/or consumed.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction.</li><li>▪ Under the Influence.</li></ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li><li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li><li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li></ul> <p><u>Third offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: Final probation requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

<p><b>Rule #1: Underage drinking</b></p> <p>Providing persons under 21 years of age with alcohol.</p> <p>Hosting a party in your room, suite, or apartment where underage drinking takes place.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li><li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li><li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li></ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><u>Third offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year suspension.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><u>Upon Return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Removal from all University housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: Final probation and suspension require prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

**Rule #2**

**Possession of more than one case of beer (288 oz. or 24 12-oz. cans or bottles), two liters of wine and two liters of distilled spirits, or bulk containers.**

<b>Rule #2: Exceeding alcohol possession limit</b>	
Possession of more alcohol than stated in rule. (applies to individuals over 21 years of age)	<u>First offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year disciplinary warning.</li></ul> <u>Second offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction.</li></ul> <u>Third offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction</li><li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li><li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li></ul>

**Rule #3**

**Possession, personal use, or purchasing of marijuana, controlled substances, prescription drugs prescribed to another person, illegal drugs; or possession of drug paraphernalia containing drug residue.**

<b>Rule #3: Personal Use/Possession of Drugs</b>	
<p>Possession/personal use of marijuana.</p> <p>Possession of drug paraphernalia with marijuana residue.</p> <p>Purchasing or attempting to purchase a small amount of marijuana.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Marijuana 101.</li> </ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li> </ul> <p><u>Third offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Final probation requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

<p>Possession/personal use of prescription drugs prescribed to another.</p> <p>Purchasing or attempting to purchase prescription drugs prescribed to another.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li> </ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li> </ul>

Possession/personal use of other drugs.  Possession of drug paraphernalia with residue other than marijuana.  Purchasing or attempting to purchase other drugs.	<u>First offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <u>Second offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year suspension.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <u>Upon return:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Removal from all University housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

**Rule 4. Distribution of controlled substances, prescription drugs prescribed to another person, or illegal drugs.**

<b>Rule #4: Distribution/Sale of Drugs</b>	
Selling small quantity of marijuana (up to 4 oz. or 113g).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 semester to 2 years suspension.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><u>Upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all University housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>
<b>Rule #4: Distribution/Sale of Drugs</b>	
Selling large quantities of marijuana (more than 4 oz. or 113g).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year suspension to expulsion.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><u>If suspended, upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all University housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension and expulsion require prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>
<b>Rule #4: Distribution/Sale of Drugs</b>	
Selling other drugs (i.e. cocaine, heroin, ecstasy, controlled prescriptions, etc.).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year suspension to expulsion.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension and expulsion requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

**Rule #5****Theft of property or services; or knowingly possessing stolen property.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<b>Rule #5: Theft</b>	
Possession of sign (non-traffic).  Not paying a cab fare.  Minor theft from a dining hall.  Using lost or stolen parking permit.  Falsely reporting lost parking permit to obtain second at discount.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> <li>▪ Restitution if appropriate.</li> </ul>
<b>Rule #5: Theft</b>	
Theft of property or services.	In general a sanction for theft will include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ A period of disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Restitution.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul> However, there is a broad range of behaviors. Proposed sanctions reflect guidelines for typical <u>minor</u> theft. Sanctions should reflect the severity of the theft. For instances of <u>major</u> theft or acts that pose a threat to the community, loss of access to facilities and/or loss of housing and parental notification may be considered. <b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b>
<b>Rule #5: Theft</b>	
Lounge furniture in a student room.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 6 months disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul> <b>Note: Prior to this becoming a student conduct matter, the individual should have been asked to return the furniture.</b>
<b>Rule #5: Theft</b>	
Possession of traffic sign (stop, yield, etc.).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li> <li>▪ Restitution if appropriate.</li> </ul>

**Rule #6**

**Manufacture, sale, possession or use of altered or another person's documents, including those used for identification.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<b>Rule #6: IDs</b>	
Possession of false identification.  Use of altered or false identification.  Use of another person's documents for identification.	<u>First offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> <li>▪ Under the Influence if appropriate.</li> </ul> <u>Second offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li> </ul>
<b>Rule #6: IDs</b>	
Manufacture or sale of false identification.	<u>First offense:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year suspension.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <u>Upon return:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b>

**Rule #7**

**Intentionally or recklessly destroying or damaging property.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<b>Rule #7: Damage</b>	
Damage.	<p>In general a sanction for damage will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ A period of disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Restitution.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction.</li></ul> <p>However, there is a broad range of behaviors. Proposed sanctions reflect guidelines for typical <u>minor</u> damage. Sanctions should reflect the severity of the damage.</p> <p>For instances of <u>major</u> damage, loss of access to facilities and/or loss of housing and parental notification may be considered.</p> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>
<b>Rule #7: Damage</b>	
Damaging exit sign.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li></ul>
Punching hole in wall or window.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Restitution.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction.</li></ul>

**Rule #8**

Endangering, threatening or causing physical harm to any person or causing reasonable apprehension of such harm.

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<b>Rule #8: Physical Harm</b>	
Simple shove.  Isolated threat.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> <li>▪ Loss of contact with victim if situation warrants.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment or is bias related. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Physical Harm</b>	
Physical fight without weapons.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li> <li>▪ Loss of contact.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment or is bias related. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Physical Harm</b>	
Assault without weapon with minor injuries.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation to 1 year suspension.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li> <li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated or suspended.</li> </ul> <p><u>If suspended, upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Final probation and suspension require prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment or is bias related. Assault with weapon with minor or no injuries.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 to 2 years suspension.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><u>Upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li><li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment or is bias related. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Physical Harm</b>	
Assault with serious injuries.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 2 year suspension to expulsion.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><u>If suspended, upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li><li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>

**Endangering, threatening or causing physical harm to any person or causing reasonable apprehension of such harm.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Use of bicycles, in-line skates, roller skates, skateboards, or similar devices inside building.  Using baseball or softball bats on grounds of University not designated for that purpose.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 6 months disciplinary warning.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Prior to this becoming a student conduct matter, the individual should have been asked to discontinue action.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Throwing objects from windows that may cause minor injury.  Climbing on the roof of any building.  Entering or exiting building from windows.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 6 months disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Throwing objects from windows that may cause serious injury.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if removed from housing.</li> </ul>
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Boxing or wrestling with no injury.	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 6 months disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul>
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Boxing or wrestling resulting in physical injury.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation to suspension.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanctions.</li> <li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Range is based on severity of injury. Consult with the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Suspension requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p>
<b>Rule #8: Endangering behavior</b>	
Tampering with life or personal safety equipment such as automated external defibrillators (AED).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 years disciplinary probation.</li> <li>▪ Restitution.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if the incident is the result of alcohol intoxication or drug impairment. Typically the sanction should be doubled.</b></p>

**Rule #9**

**Stalking or communicating in a manner likely to cause injury, distress, or emotional or physical discomfort and which serves no legitimate purpose.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<p><b>Rule #9: Stalking/Distressing Communication</b></p> <p>Communicating in a manner likely to cause distress or emotional or physical discomfort <b>without</b> the threat of physical injury.</p> <p>Communicating in a manner likely to cause distress, or emotional or physical discomfort <b>with</b> the threat of physical injury - <b>isolated threat</b>.</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 1 year disciplinary probation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction.</li><li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li><li>▪ Relocation if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation to appropriate area.</li><li>▪ Parental notification if relocated.</li></ul> <p><u>Second offense (with different victim than first offense):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Disciplinary probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x 2.</li><li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li><li>▪ Relocation or if already relocated, removal from all university housing if appropriate.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation privileges to appropriate area or all residential areas.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><u>Third offense (with different victims):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li><li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li><li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li><li>▪ Loss of visitation privileges to all residential areas.</li><li>▪ Educational sanction x3.</li><li>▪ Parental notification.</li></ul> <p><b>Note: For second and/or third offenses involving the same victim, see Rule #21.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Final probation requires prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if harassment is bias related. **Stalking or communicating in a manner likely to cause injury, distress, or emotional or physical discomfort and which serves no legitimate purpose.**

Typical Behavior	Sanctions
<p><b>Rule #9: Stalking/Distressing Communication</b></p> <p>Communicating in a manner likely to cause injury, distress, or emotional or physical discomfort <b>with</b> the threat of physical injury - <b>repeated intentional threats</b>.</p> <p>Stalking (The obsessive pursuit of a victim in a menacing manner that evokes fear in the victim).</p>	<p><u>First offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation to 1 year suspension.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><u>If not suspended:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li> <li>▪ Educational sanction x 3.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing (if victim lives in university housing).</li> <li>▪ If removed from housing, loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <p><u>If suspended, upon return:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Required reflective paper and interview.</li> <li>▪ Final probation until graduation.</li> <li>▪ Loss of contact with victim.</li> <li>▪ Removal from all university housing.</li> <li>▪ Loss of visitation to all residential areas.</li> </ul> <p><u>Second offense:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Expulsion.</li> <li>▪ Parental notification.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note: Final probation, suspension, and expulsion require prior approval from the Office of Student Conduct.</b></p> <p><b>Note: Consider enhanced sanctioning if harassment is bias related.</b></p>

<b>Rule #11: Sexual assault and rape</b>
